Committee Makeup

The JU Editorial Board shall consist of the Editor and Associate Editors of the Journal, and at least one Active or Senior Member from each Section. The Editor shall request the Section to submit the names of three candidates based on a needed area of expertise to be defined by the Editor. The Editor shall then select the representative for a three-year term (renewable once). AUAER Bylaws 2022*

Additional members of the Editorial Board include Assistant Editors and Section Editors.

The at-large editorial board members (non-voting) include Early Career Editors, Online Content Editors, Chief Statisticians and statistical board.

Mission Statement

Reporting

The Journal of Urology[®] Editor reports to the AUA Board of Directors, who set the overarching strategic goals for the editor. However, the Editorial Board retains oversight of the peer review process and the editorial selection of submissions to be published in the Journal, with no input from the Board of Directors.

Editorial Board Meetings

The Board meets four times per year, once per quarter. The Board will meet in person at the Annual Meeting and by videoconference for the other three meetings.

Qualifications/ Responsibilities

The JU Editorial Board is responsible for publication content oversight. The Editorial Board assists the Editor in establishing editorial policies and strategies and in managing the peer review process.

Editor The Editor directs the publication of JU and is responsible for its general management. The Editor makes recommendations pertaining to improved dissemination of this high-impact journal focused on the advances of urology research. The overarching objective of this position is to maintain the highly regarded editorial integrity of the journal while implementing publishing innovations that keep *The Journal of Urology*[®] relevant and best in class. The Editor oversees an editorial board, including Associate, Section, Assistant and Feature Editors, and Editorial Board members, on matters of editorial policy and recommends nominees for all editorial appointments to the journal. The Editor also partners with the AUA Publications Department staff to coordinate editorial and operational activities of the journal.

The Senior Associate Editor, in respect to date of appointment, shall serve as Acting Editor in the absence or incapacity of the Editor.

Section Reps Assist the Editor in the selection of papers for publication, oversight of the peer review process, and general management of *The Journal of Urology*.

Section Representatives will meet the following criteria:

- Prior scholarly publishing editorial experience required.
- Must have an extensive publication record in high-impact, peer-reviewed scholarly journals.
- Must have thorough knowledge of the peer review process, from submission to publication, including all decision types.
- Will have an understanding of scholarly publishing threats and opportunities (Open Access, preprint policies, authorship/contributorship, and more).

Criteria for Selecting Next Editor

Openings for the JU Editor are announced every six years at the webpage AUAnet.org/JUEditor. A job description highlighting the qualifications is posted on that site. The next search will begin fall of 2026. The JU Editor is selected by a Board Search Committee.

Recent Accomplishments (2023)

In 2023, *The Journal of Urology*[®] continued to lead urology in overall citations and social media followers, and the publication's Journal Impact Factor remained strong. JU launched an innovative new Pathway to Publication program this year, which identified top-rated AUA2023 abstracts and invited authors to submit full-length research articles on those topics for rapid review consideration. The program was a tremendous success, with 11 manuscripts publishing simultaneously with their abstract presentations at the 2023 AUA Annual Meeting. Because of this program's success, it will be extended to *Urology Practice*[®] and JU Open Plus in 2024.
